## STAND UP, TAKE ACTION, MAKE NOISE

The World Academy participated in the September 18 United Nations Program designed to bring attention to the goal to end poverty worldwide. A three-day event was organized to:

I) MAKE NOISE featuring performances by the Sias marching band, symphony, cheerleaders, and students clubs,

II) TAKE ACTION with presentations on the eight Millennium Development Goals:

- 1. End Poverty and Hunger
- 2. University Education
- 3. Gender Equality
- 4. Child Health
- 5. Maternal Health
- 6. Combat HIV/AIDS
- 7. Environmental Sustainabilty
- 8. Develop Global Partnership

And III) STAND UP requesting that Sias students sign a commitment card selecting the MDG they will stand for. The commitments are being compiled into a database for future engagement of the students in World Academy events related to the stand they represent. There are now 4738 students committed to taking a stand for the women on one of the MDG projects.

The Academy will continue to enroll students throughout the year and work toward engaging the entire Sias student body in reaching the goals by the 2015 deadline.

## International Forum on Women in Urban Development

More than 300 women from 58 countries attended the invitational International Conference on Women in Urban Development and Commemoration of the 15<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Beijing Declaration on Women. The Conference was held September 16<sup>th</sup> -18<sup>th</sup> in Shanghai, China and was hosted by the All China Women's Federation (ACWF), led by ACWF President Madam Chen Zhilli, Madam Chen is also the Vice Chairman of the Standing Committee of the National People's Congress.

Jerrie Leberle was invited to attend on behalf of Global Interactions and the World Academy for the Future of Women. Leberle expressed the privilege it was to be among women world leaders and stated:

## Freshman Military Review at Sias University
