



Cultural Immersion/Language/Science/Leadership Instructional Staff Application

Challenge:TOMORROW is seeking Instructional Staff for volunteer positions for an innovative and challenging youth program to be conducted in China, July 6-28, 2008. This 23-day program will begin in Los Angeles on July 6 for staff and on July 8 for students, when 100 American youth ages 12-16 gather for orientation before departing to Shanghai, Zhengzhou, Moon Lake eco-resort in Inner Mongolia, and Beijing, China, for an extensive residential learning experience with their Chinese student counterparts.

Students and staff will be immersed in China's rural culture in Henan Province and Inner Mongolia and urban culture in Beijing. Students and staff will stay on SIAS International University campus in Xinzheng, near Zhengzhou for the first half of the program. www.sias.edu.cn They will be joined by Chinese students from the adjoining area. Participants will engage in Mandarin lessons, science exploration, and cross cultural and leadership activities through teambuilding, inquiry methodologies, and creative problem solving. Instructional staff from both countries will facilitate activities through which students will apply these skills as they identify and seek solutions to local and global issues as future leaders. A day trip to Shaolin Temple, the world oldest Martial Arts School is included. The second half of the program will be in Inner Mongolia in the Tengeri Desert. Students will live with minority Chinese students in yurts at an eco-resort. Activities will be expanded to include environmental studies related to desertification and desert plant and animal life, conducted by local staff and scientists. The final visit will be to Beijing to climb the Great Wall, visit Tiananamen Square, the Forbidden City, and the Olympic Games venue. The activities will expand to include urban issues and build on the skills and discoveries of the previous weeks. Service learning and culminating activities will add to the bonding and friendships developed throughout these experiences.

The instructional staff, under the direction of the program directors, are charged with the implementation of the curriculum and related activities. Instructional staff should have experience teaching young people in different environments and a keen interest in assisting youth in team building, problem solving, and visioning a world in which they want to live. A 1 to 15 ratio of staff to students fosters personal relationships and strong group connections. The role of the instructional staff is to foster high levels of engagement, learning, inclusion, interactions, and creativity among the participating Chinese and American youth.

Responsibilities of instructional staff include:

- participate in training sessions prior to departure. This will include phone conferences, training in Los Angeles July 8 -10, and ongoing training and development throughout the duration of the program
- assist with all airport arrivals and departures of students, including Los Angeles, before and after international flights
- assist program directors with registration, orientation and program implementation
- serve as faciliators of learning activities and work with assigned students
- introduce and/or coordinate program activities
- assist in the supervision and support of all students
- escort students during on-site and off-site activities, field trips, and historic and cultural site visits
- be available to counsel students, deal with homesickness and behaviors that do not contribute to group learning and program outcomes, and generally be available to students at all times
- monitor morning and night routines, supervise meal and break times as directed, and other duties as assigned

We are seeking instructional staff with multi-cultural interests and experiences who have:

- expertise or interest in working with creative students
- familiarity with Mandarin language and Chinese culture, or strong commitment to learn
- interest in promoting leadership, teambuilding, and preparing global citizens for a 'flat world' society
- expertise/interest in science content, hands-on science, and science exploration
- ability in some creative area—Music, Art, Drama, Computer Skills, etc.
- creative problem solving experience
- imagination and a sense of humor
- desire to work in collaboration with Chinese instructional counterparts and program directors
- international travel experience is desirable
- commitment to a full 23 day program, and
- intent and desire to use this experience to further personal leadership and relationships for future international work

Upon applicant approval Global Interactions will issue a letter of invitation to participate as Instructional Staff. Within 30 days the application must submit a deposit of \$600. \$200.00 non refundable should applicant cancel. Full return should this application be denied or if the organizers cancel.
